THREE DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS HONORED FOR AP EFFORTS

February 29, 2024

(MACON, GA) – Three Bibb County School District high schools were honored for their Advanced Placement efforts, according to a release from Georgia School Superintendent Richard Woods. Howard High School was named an AP Access & Support School and an AP Stem School, while Rutland High School was named an AP Challenge School and Northeast High School was named an AP Expansion School.

The AP Access & Support designation recognizes schools with at least 30 percent of AP exams taken by African-American and Hispanic Students and 30 percent of all exams scoring 3 or higher out of a 5-point scale. AP Stem Schools have at least five students testing in at least four AP STEM courses. AP Challenge Schools are schools that have 900 or fewer students, with exams administered in English, Math and Social Studies, and AP Expansion Schools showed a 25 percent growth in AP student participation.

All designations required schools to have at least 25 tests administered. Advanced Placement exams are administered by the College Board and are one of the ways high school students earn college credit before they receive their high school diploma.
